A NOTE FROM THE SECRETARY-TREASURER

It has been more than a year now since I have been at the DCRA. So far it has been an interesting and challenging year to say the least. Since the 2008 Canadian Championships were somewhat small compared to past years, it was a good opportunity for me to get my feet wet and run a small set of matches to gain some experience. I was pleased to learn that I would be backed up by many people that would make my job much easier. These people included the range officers led by Mr. Keith Bornn, our famous butt markers from Smith Falls led by Pat Quinn, and the QM led by Ian Rumbold. Ian was also new at this game, but still managed to do a great job of a very demanding, and often thankless, task.

This breaking-in period came to a sudden halt, though, by the Canadian Forces Small Arms Competition (CFSAC). Last year the Canadian Forces contracted out the running of their national service rifle competitions. The DCRA successfully bid on this contract and we conducted the matches for three weeks in September. Once again I was backed up by a spectacular team including: Keith Cunningham on the rifle side; David Burke, a newcomer to the DCRA, on the combat pistol side; Don Ogden and his team did the heavy lifting; and Betty Ann Ferguson ensured everything in the office came together as it should have. Serge Bissonnette and Bill Molnar were also key to the success of the contract. Great job everyone and thanks for making me look good. The DCRA will again bid on this contract in 2009 and hopefully by the time you read this, planning will be well under way. By the way, if you are interested in being a range officer during these matches (30 August - 20 September) please send me your credentials at the DCRA office as soon as possible.

During my short time here there have been a few notable changes in the DCRA office. Jim Thompson, the long serving programme director, handed over the reins to Dan Chisholm. I was very grateful for all the help that Jim provided me in my first few months and I now look forward to some new ideas in the shooting programme from Dan. Very early in 2009 Peter Vaughan decided to enjoy his golden years and retire from the DCRA. In his place I have hired Laura Henderson to handle the books and membership of the DCRA. She is active with the cadet organization and familiar with the shooting world. I hope you will all make her feel welcome as she learns the ropes at the DCRA.

While I don't want to be too controversial in my first submission to the Marksman, I would not be doing the organization any favours if I did not point out some of the observations that I have

made over the past year and perhaps provide some commentary on these observations. Therefore I would like to put an idea or two out there for the consideration of the membership:

We all know that the DCRA comes from a proud and long history. I think that we can all acknowledge that, over the past number of years, there have been many factors (whether political, social, economic or others) that have come together to weaken the DCRA as an organization. I have noticed that the DCRA is not an organization that is quick to transform and adapt to changing conditions. I am referring specifically to the organizational structure of the DCRA.

At a glance, one can observe that the DCRA has not changed its organization significantly in many decades. It is still organized as the robust organization it was 50 and 100 years ago; however, it would seem that in order to survive in today's quickly changing society the DCRA must evolve and adapt into a structure that can make effective decisions quickly, and take the organization in a certain direction whatever that direction may be. Our large council and executive organizations are too big and seem unable to quickly and effectively bring about change. I have looked at minutes from past council and executive meetings and the issues and agendas are, for the most part, the same as they were many years ago. I believe a major change is needed to eliminate the council and to shrink the executive to a size that can move the association forward. This organization can continue to have regional representation, but is must be smaller.

To help emphasize my point: late last year one of our members surveyed the membership about shooting issues and their involvement in the Canadian Championships. While the survey was somewhat useful, and was aimed at the right objectives, I fear that it will take a lot longer than is necessary for the issues it raised to be addressed by the organization. Further to this, F-class shooting is becoming more and more popular, could the DCRA have truly embraced F-class shooting earlier? Are other opportunities now being missed?

In summary, I believe that the organization should eliminate council and adopt a smaller executive; perhaps 5-7 members elected for a specific term ensuring regional representation and enabling quick, effective, progressive and proactive decision-making. The trouble with my suggestions is that it is often very difficult to convince organizations such as the council and the executive to make changes to themselves. It is a bit like trying to make changes to the Canadian Senate - most recognize that change is necessary, but a significant paradigm shift needs to occur before anything will change, and the change has to come from within. I just hope we don't wait too long.

I've recently taken over from Jim Thompson, who "temporarily" took on the Programme Committee job and has been doing it for the past twenty years. Jim has left all of us with an absolutely first-rate match for our annual fullbore Canadian Championships, which are at this point a premier national and international shooting destination. My main goal is to keep it so; a secondary goal is to not serve in this position nearly as long as Jim did!

Not surprisingly most of this year's match will be the same as in previous years. There are some changes for this year, particularly for F-Class. Please visit my "DCRA Programme" blog (web address above) for more details on these changes, to provide feedback or ask questions, or to see any programme-related news that happens after this Marksman has gone to press.

For both TR and F-class, there is no longer a bullet weight limit for .223 Rem rifles.

Prize Ceremony. This is an important event that recognizes the accomplishments of our shooters at our Canadian Championships, its only fault is that it takes a very long time to get through our long and involved prize list and trophy table. This year we will continue to call each and every winner to the podium and present them with their award. And when one of our heavy hitters is called up to the podium, we will at that time present them with most of the awards they have won. While still giving Fred the applause he deserves for winning one match, and also giving John full applause and recognition for winning 7 matches, we hope to make the ceremony a bit shorter.

Social. We enjoy the company of other shooters, and not just on the range while shooting. We will be renting a large 60'x40' tent for the duration of our Championships, which we hope shooters will use throughout the day and in the evening. We expect to have light lunches (sandwiches, etc) available there. We will be returning to our tradition of running a "Meet and Greet" social dinner on the first Saturday evening in the tent. We'll be trying a move "upmarket", and will be having a prominent local catering company provide a full roast hip of beef buffet dinner complete with dessert and all the fixings. We expect that this will be a wonderful dinner, foodwise and companywise; please purchase a ticket on your entry form, so that we can be assured of the minimum numbers we need to hold this big dinner.

For the next three years, we will be trialling **ICFRA Rules**, for both TR and F-Class. We will be using our existing **DCRA Rules** to 'backstop' the ICFRA rules where needed - for example, rules

regarding team eligibility, residence definitions etc. We have made two minor changes to the ICFRA Rules, firstly we have amended the ICFRA Message 6 (so that you do not forfeit the value of your shot when you challenge for an additional hit), and we have also amended the ICFRA Make-rifle-safe procedure (we don't mandate that the bolt be removed as part of the rifle inspection process). Please see the DCRA website for an online copy of our amended ICFRA Rules and our DCRA Rules. As previously announced, there is now no TR rifle weight limit, and now the TR minimum trigger pull is 0.5kg. No changes are needed to existing TR rifles in order to stay legal.

Our rules (DCRA, modified ICFRA TR, modified ICFRA F-Class) are available for free from the DCRA website. **A printed rule book** containing all three will be available for purchase at the Canadian Championships for \$10.

As always, the DCRA asks for **early entries to the Canadian Championships.** We need (and appreciate!) your money, because there are a lot of up-front expenses involved. We also need to make fairly precise arrangements for enough target markers and range staff, well before the end of the school year. In order to encourage you to help us, we're offering you the option to pay only **half your entry fees** when you register, with the balance due 26-June. We're also holding an **Early Bird Draw** for ten \$50 cash prizes, for entries received by 15-May.

Meals and Accommodations at Connaught continue to be an (overall) good deal. For those of us staying in DND accommodations our room plus 3 mess meals come for a bundled price of \$30 per day. In my personal mental accounting, I am most comfortable thinking of this as a very good deal of \$30/night for my room, with three optional meals included for free. If you want to grumble about paying for meals that you won't eat, as only shooters can grumble, please email me directly and I'll provide a sympathetic ear; please don't blame the DCRA office staff, they are on our side and are not to blame for this. For those shooters not staying in DND accommodations, the mess will be selling lunches on a cash basis, likely for \$10 as in previous years.

The **Wind Club** has sponsored **a new \$500 prize** for the winner of the Canadian Target Rifle Championship (Bisley Aggregate).

The Sierra Canadian 300m National ISSF Championship will be a two-day, 120 shot event this year, complete with licensed SFC officials. Competitors firing with ISSF-compliant equipment will be eligible for selection to the Canadian 300m ISSF team that will shoot in the 2010 Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championship match in India.

F-Class and TR will be squadded separately. We'll still see each other on the range, but we will no longer shoot with each other on the same target. In some ways this is an improvement over our tradition of mixing everybody together, in other ways it is a loss. F-Class shooters will shoot on an **F-Class Target with a "1/2-MOA" V-Bull, scoring will be V-5-4...** The F-Class V-bull will be implemented with a stick-on patch applied inside the standard 1997 DCRA TR V-bull, that will be exactly half its diameter; so at 300m the F-Class V will be about 0.45MOA and the bull will be about 0.9MOA, while at 900m the V will be about 0.6MOA and the bull about 1.2MOA.

We are accepting entries in the new ICFRA **F/Restricted** class, which will be shot internationally for the first time this year at the 2009 F Class World Championships in Bisley (and my very best wishes to the Canadian Team who will be competing there!). F/Restricted allows for calibres .308 Win or .223 Rem, with no bullet weight limit, and for a front rest it allows an attached bipod but not a benchrest. As you can see it is quite similar to the original Canadian F/Farquharson class, but not identical. Time will tell whether our shooters will choose one of these over the other, or whether we ought to continue to offer both. For now and for the next few years we will offer both, and we will let shooters' attendance serve as their vote on this matter.

We will now fully and equally recognize three equipment divisions of F-Class, and provided that there are at least three entries, will award full prizes to each class, including a DCRA gold medal for every match winner. Based on their equipment, shooters will compete for prizes in **F/Open**, **F/Restricted or F/Farquharson**.

I'm looking forward to seeing you in August, and would love to hear any comments, questions or suggestions you might have (email: dmc@danielchisholm.com).

Please come shoot with us in August, and get your entry in now to let us know you'll be coming. At certain key dates we will make final decisions on staffing, after which we can only accept entries on a space-available basis.

Where are the Black Powder shooters?

In another section of this edition of the Marksman, I have commented on my views regarding the responses that were received from the October '08 questionnaire.

My commitment to you was to review our disciplines to ensure that we are making the best use of out limited resources to meet our mission statement (see page 27). This is being carried out with the disciplines which the DCRA presently endorses.

One discipline which has been pushed forward for my attention is Black Powder. I have reviewed the file and find that there is a chronic lack of Black Powder member support at the Canadian Fullbore Rifle Championship (CFRC).

The reality is that last year there were six competitors for the National Black Powder Matches. This downward trend has been going on for years. This situation has to improve for Black Powder to survive on the National and International stage.

It is my decision, in consultation with knowledgeable and committed Black Powder enthusiasts that a year of rebuilding is in order.

Therefore I have advised the Chair of the Black Powder Committee that there will be a **one-year hiatus** of the Black Powder Nationals at the CFRC to enable the discipline to reestablish itself.

The goal of the Black Powder Committee is to bring the attendance up for the 2010 CFRC.

This is the challenge for the Black Powder Committee. They will have to consider how to increase the attendance of their competitors at the 2010 CFRC.

My suggestions to the Black Powder Chair include the following:

- a) Encouraging participation at regional/provincial level competitions/practices to the known competitors. This can be a measuring stick on how well the competitors are faring and interested in taking part in National and International meets.
- b) An advertising push offering information on the sport through seminars, internet links, publications and articles on all other matters dealing with the art of Black Powder shooting to draw new interest.
- c) Etc...

Comments from the Chairman of the Shooting Committee on the recent DCRA Questionnnaire

Aquestionnaire was sent out last Fall with a return date of 22nd of October 08 originating from one of our Life Governors and sanctioned by the Executive.

The questionnaire was directed to membership at large and any interested parties trying to determine what they felt were the obstacles that prevented an increased participation in the Canadian Fullbore Rifle Championships (CFRC).

Of the sixty (+/- 3) responses received there was a healthy balance between shooters who actively support the CFRC, those that did and those who do not.

In reviewing the responses there are three themes that are consistent;

- 1) the format is attractive (i.e. no marking, leisure time..),
- 2) the shoot is too long for the majority of shooters responding,
- 3) the shoot is too expensive for the majority of shooters responding.

It is my view, as Chairman of the Shooting Committee, that a review of the activities under my wing has to be undertaken to

justify the costs and duration of the activities and sub-activities in the CFRC.

My first objective will be to examine those activities to ensure that they fall in line with our Mission Statement.

Next would be "do they contribute value"? Is this activity National in participation? Does it bring in new members?

Then the hard question. Do they meet their budgets? Sometimes you have to spend money to raise the interest level of an activity but that is a short term objective. In the long run, the activity has to be self supporting. This is especially true for our organization, as there is very little outside sources of funding.

I will be working with the activity chairs to see what they feel is justifiable under the guidelines.

As I have new activity chairs in Black Powder and Target Rifle, I will ask your indulgence and patience, as I will report my findings and subsequent recommended actions in the next "Canadian Marksman".





UPDATE ON WINDFLAGS

In 2008 a mixture of nylon and cotton wind flags were used during the Canadian Championships due to insufficient cotton flags being available. Since DCRA flags are the same colour as the military flags it was easy to mix them up but, unlike the nylon flags, the DCRA flags had to be properly dried before storage. Unfortunately this had not been done and has resulted in the deterioration of many of the flags. The planning and priorities committee reviewed the flag situation and has agreed that a two-colour flag, blue and yellow, being the DCRA colours, be adopted. The Fifty Club had agreed that it could fund the purchase as it was for the general good of the DCRA rather than for a specific team or individual. Several PRAs expressed interest in obtaining flags.

The DCRA has therefore purchased 50 blue and yellow cotton wind flags from Paul Bawden at his quoted price of \$78 plus taxes (\$88.14, total cost \$4407); flags to be approximately 6 ft high at the base, 13 ft long with the tip reinforced to prevent fraying; PRAs were invited to participate in the order at a cost of \$90 plus shipping from Ottawa per flag. The flags are expected to be delivered in the spring and we look forward to seeing these new flags used at the 2009 Canadian Championships.

Phase II 1962-1981

by Lawrence (Larry) Fish

This is the 11th installment of "Recollections of a Marksman, Phase II 1962-1981" by Lawrence (Larry) Fish

As the 1976 Reserve Force Small Arms Competitions, by then designated RFSAC, approached I was glad to see that some of the recommendations in my after action report had been incorporated in the new program which was a great improvement over that initial year. But it would take a couple more years before all the glitches were ironed out.

With a good number of the previous year's team members and a sprinkling of new ones who had emerged as contenders during the Central Militia Area competitions, the team commenced the '76 RFSAC. I drew first blood by winning the King trophy deliberate at 200 and 300 yards and followed it by winning the Fire with Movement match. In team events we won the 4-member Snap Shooting event as well as the 12-member Rifle Championship, a good year for CMA.

In the late fall of '76 I was asked by CMA to conduct sniper rifle training programs. (My availability was due to another seasonal lay-off which badgered me throughout the entire time that I worked in construction.) My students would be Regular Force instructors from all infantry units in the system and would total just over a score. It seemed there were no longer any former snipers left in the Regular's system and I was the only one with sniper experience. It would later turn out that Lt-Col Ivor McLeod, a member of my CMA team, had also served in the sniper role in the British Army, but that did not emerge until later.

I therefore prepared to meet my students who, predictably and understandably, would feel a little chagrined at having a Militiaman or 'Saturday night soldier' teaching them anything. Provided with plenty of the new, C3 sniper rifles for my students and a large, hangar sized classroom at CFB Borden, I gave them a hands-on session to acquaint them with the weapon. They were all senior NCOs and it was only natural that some sensitivity was apparent on that first morning, but as time passed they began to loosen up as they realized there was a lot to learn. Their first jolt came when I conducted a vertical sight test to determine if sights, both scope and micrometer, were precisely mounted with no deviation as sights were elevated. As an inclined sight clearly creates an exponential error as one withdraws to further distant ranges, my students began to grasp the validity of such a test.

To achieve this I had prepared targets with a vertical centre line graduated from 200 to 1000 yards, then had the students, looking somewhat askance by now, mount the targets using plumb-bobs to guarantee that each of their targets was absolutely perpendicular. Then, with rifles sand-bagged in position, had them elevate the sights up the target's centre line. As each deviating sight was identified, I described the amount of point of impact error which would have occurred had that rifle's sights not been corrected. The attending armourer then made the necessary adjustments. My students were beginning to get the drift. By the time I had acquainted them with the devastating effects of canting at the longer ranges their heads were full enough of theory: it was time to go shooting.

Mons ranges at Borden provided all ranges back to 1000 yards. I got them all zeroed at 200 yards with both scope and micrometer sights, then took them back to the target hut for a session on wind effects. They obviously had a great deal to learn which certainly could not all be achieved in the short time allotted, but they had become converts and plunged into the practices with enthusiasm. Getting good centre-line shooting at the short ranges, I gradually moved them back to 600 yards where wind effects gave them a hard time. That was back far enough. Beyond what I could assist them, only practice and experience at their home ranges could round out their skills.

As our time together expired a full dress, passing out parade was ordered by a senior staff officer. My students, having only seen me in combat gear, were rather taken aback when they saw me in CF greens and WW II decorations. If there were any doubts about my soldierly credentials they disappeared there and then. It had been a pleasure to work with those instructors and it would be my good fortune to reunite with several throughout the remainder of my military career.

Wind Club members are very proud of their past history with many Queen's Prize, Commonwealth Games, Governor General's Prize, Grand Aggregate and Canadian Championship wins. Providing a legacy for future champions is the least we can do for the sport!




Notice to Competitors Anti Doping Affairs

It is very unfortunate as this seven year old website made the process very easy. There is a possibility the website may resume but for the meantime go to www.wada-ama.org and follow the links to the 2009 banned list right on the home page at the upper right in an orange circle. Print this list off prior to seeing your doctor to help in filling out the form; take it with you as most physicians have no idea what is or is not on the list.

Remember that no change in your medical management is required.

Commonwealth Games Fullbore Events

The next Commonwealth Games will be held at New Delhi, India in October 2010. The next Commonwealth Shooting Federation (CSF) Championships will be held in India probably in February 2010. Final arrangements for the Fullbore Events have not yet been announced by the Indian Games Authorities.

Following the designated aggregate scores made in 2007 and 2008, and the final selection trial in 2008, the top four shooters were named as the training squad for the CSFC and Commonwealth Games. Mr. Sandy Peden was appointed as manager/coach by the DCRA Executive Committee. He, along with two other advisors, will coordinate the training and selection procedures for 2009. Scores at the 2009 Canadian Championships, and in a further one day trial on the day following, will form part of the process. It is hoped that three shooters will attend the CSFC in February 2010, with two being chosen subsequently to represent Canada in the Commonwealth Games Fullbore Events in October 2010.

Commonwealth Shooting Federation 300m ISSF Event

It is possible, but it is not confirmed at the time of writing, that there will be a prone 60-shot 300 metre ISSF event at the Commonwealth Shooting Federation Championships in India in February 2010. This may be for one or two shooters. The DCRA and SFC have agreed that selection for this event will be based on the 2009 DCRA Sierra 300 metre Canadian Championship, which will be expanded to a two-day event (see Programme and Schedule). Please consult the DCRA Office and DCRA web site for further details, which will be posted as soon as they become available.


